WHY SAFETY TOWN IS ESSENTIAL

Note these eye opening statistics regarding safety issues involving children:

For children ages 4 to 7 booster seats reduce injury risk by 59%

Kidnapping by a person known to the family account for over 25% of child abductions

Drowning is the second leading cause of unintentional injury-related death among children 1 to 14

An increase of 20% of children are putting laundry pods into their mouths with fatal consequences

47% of children 14 & under hospitalized for a bicycle related injury are diagnosed with traumatic brain injury
